PERIPrem Baby Passport

You have received this passport as a tool to help understand your care. If you have been admitted to hospital pre-term, i.e. before 34+0 weeks. In this booklet are the 11 steps we aim to provide before babies are born prematurely to give the best care.

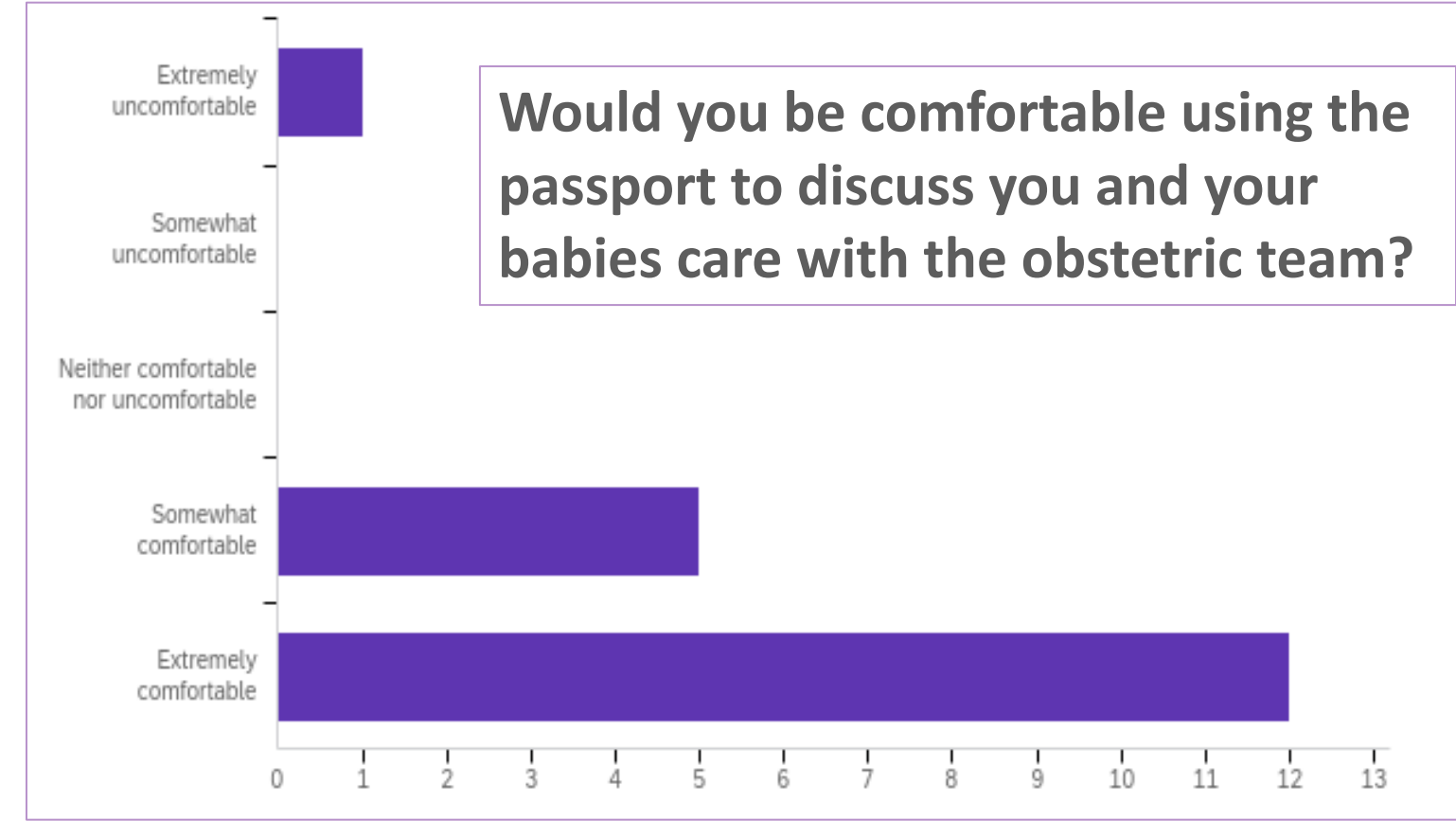
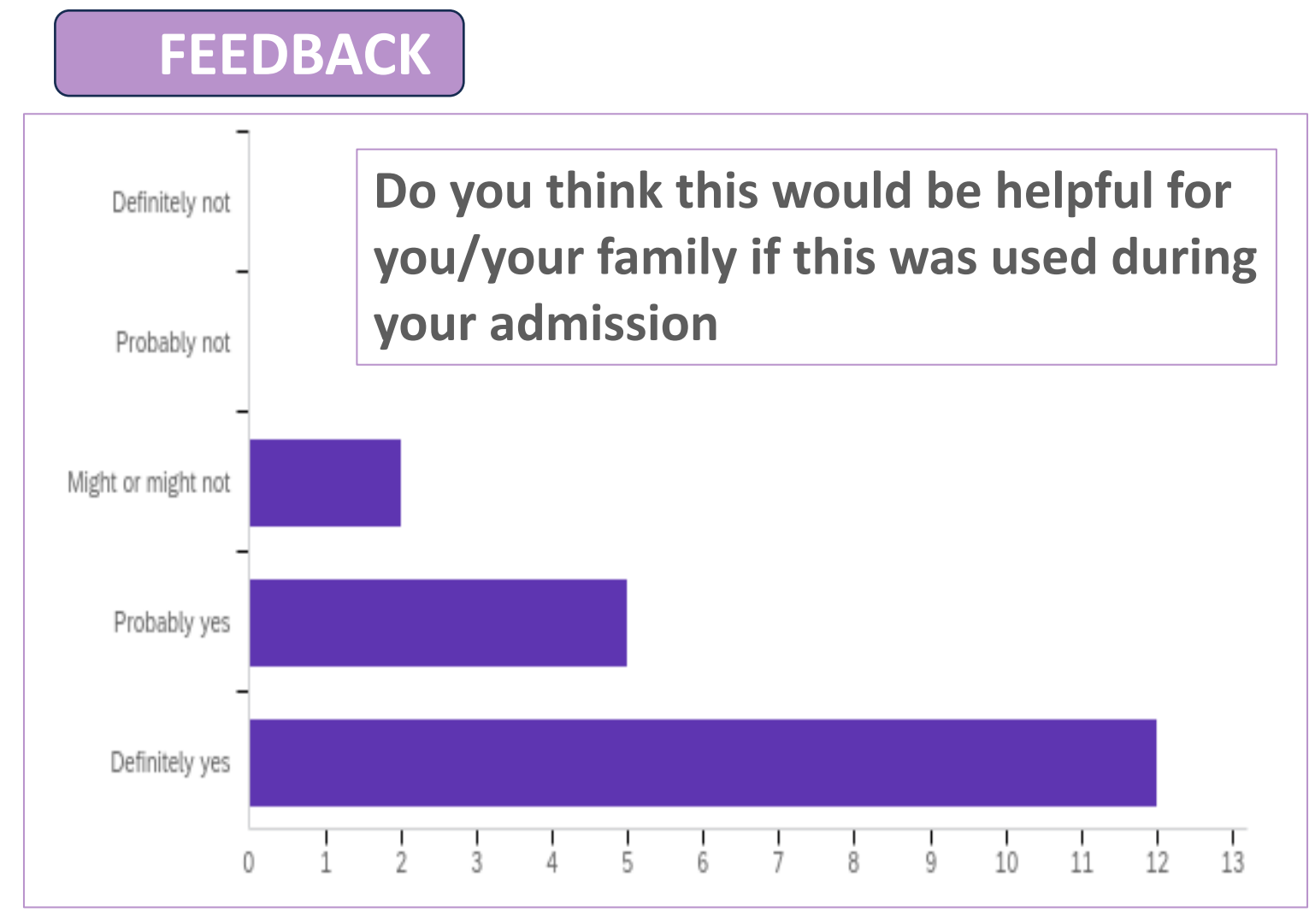
Page 2 is care before birth (antenatal management) and page 3 is care after birth (neonatal management).

Right Place of Birth (for babies born less than 27 weeks...), Neonatal Counselling (for all babies born less than 34 weeks), Antenatal Steroids (for all babies born less than 34 weeks), Antenatal Magnesium Sulphate (for all babies born less than 30 weeks), Early Breast Milk (for all babies born less than 34 weeks)

Deferred Cord Clamping (for all babies born less than 34 weeks), Thermal Care (for all babies born less than 34 weeks), Respiratory Management (for all babies born less than 34 weeks who may need it), Caffeine (for all babies born less than 30 weeks...), Probiotics (for babies born less than 32 weeks...), Prophylactic Hydrocortisone (for babies born less than 28 weeks)



- 25 Women accessed a QR Code survey
- 19 completed the survey
- 18 were <35/40 at the time of completing the survey.
- 6/19 were primiparous, 6/19 were Para 1 and 7/19 were Para 2 or more
- 10/19 had previous experienced a preterm birth

PERIPrem is a bundle of 11 care interventions, each proven to have a significant impact on brain injury and/or mortality rates in babies born prematurely.

To engage women in the process and make these interventions happen

To improve neonatal outcomes and reduce mortality and morbidity

A unique opportunity for the NHS to standardise best practice care across a multidisciplinary team.

To inform, empower and involve parents
